The 20th International Conference on Fibonacci Numbers and Their Applications was held July 25–29, 2022, at the University of Sarajevo, Bosnia and Herzegovina. It was a hybrid meeting, in person and on the Zoom platform, with the usual camaraderie and enthusiasm even though we convene only every second year.

Fifty abstracts were submitted, all of which sounded tempting. Florian Luca from South Africa gave the plenary talk, *p-adic orders of Tribonacci numbers*.
